What is Pride Cymru?



Pride Cymru is a festival to celebrate the **LGBTQ+** community.

LGBTQ+

LGBTQ+ stands for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or questioning. The plus is to be inclusive to everyone that feels part of the LGBTQ+ community but don't feel like they fit into the groups listed in LGBTQ.



Pride Cymru takes place at Cardiff Castle, Cardiff.



Pride Cymru is for everyone. All ages, **genders** and **sexualities** are welcome.

Gender

A person's gender is about how they feel, some people feel male, female, or neither. This is not always the same as the way they were born.

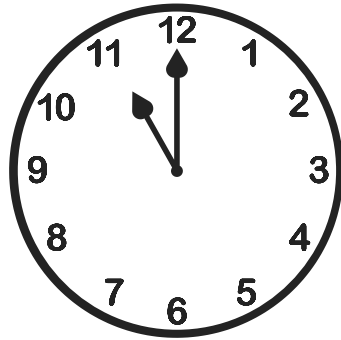
Sexuality

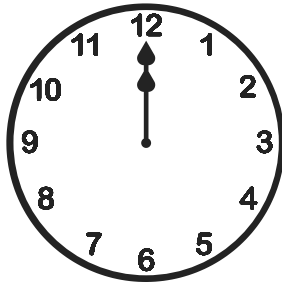
The Festival



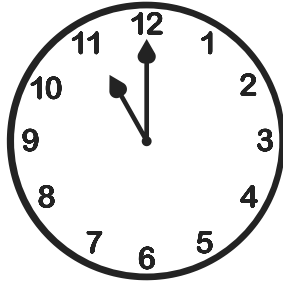
The Pride Cymru Festival is in Cardiff Castle.



Pride Cymru is outdoors so plan ahead.



Pride Cymru opens on Saturday 13th June 2026 at 12.00pm.



Pride Cymru opens on Sunday 14th June 2026 at 11.00am. 11-12pm is quiet hour. This means no music will be played and the event will be quieter.

Drag

Drag is an art form where people dress up in costumes and perform. Their performance may include singing, dancing or lip syncing.



There are also bars, food vendors and market stalls.

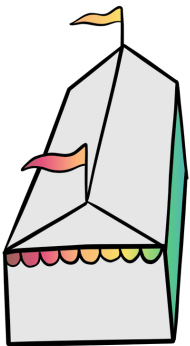
Accessibility at Pride Cymru



Pride Cymru's aim is to be accessible to everyone.



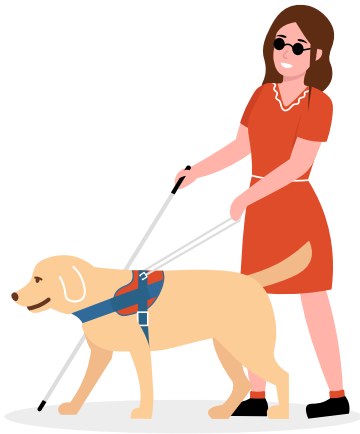
If you need help at Pride Cymru, you can ask one of our volunteers. Access volunteers wear purple Pride Cymru volunteer t-shirts, and other volunteers wear brightly coloured Pride Cymru volunteer t-shirts.



The Access Hub has lots of things to help you at Pride Cymru. It is on the right of the site, next to Medical.



The Access Hub has the Quiet Zone, with noise cancelling headphones and fidget toys.



You can bring Service animals and Emotional Support animals to Pride Cymru.



The event in a castle, there may be bumps cobbles, and divets.



There is a big Viewing Platform with lots of seating.



All performances have a **BSL** interpreter.

BSL

BSL stands for British Sign Language. It is a way of communicating with your hands which many deaf people use.



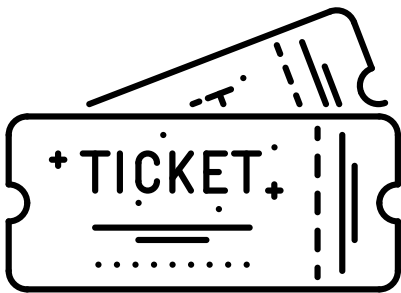
There is a separate queue for people with accessibility needs.

Tickets



It is best to buy your tickets before you come to Pride Cymru.

You can use cash to buy your ticket on the day.



If you need a carer to come with you, they can get a free ticket.

Buy your accessibility ticket online, then you will get emailed a form for a carer ticket.



If you need accessible parking, you can book it on the form sent to you when you buy an accessibility ticket.
